

FESTIVAL FAQ

Los Angeles International Ukulele Festival is committed to fostering a welcoming and relaxed atmosphere and ask that you adhere to the following guidelines in order to ensure a great experience for everyone! Los Angeles International Ukulele Festival will take place, rain or shine.

IS THE FESTIVAL ALL AGES?

Yes, the festival is an all-ages event. Children 12 and under are free to attend with paid adult admission.

HOW DO I GET TO THE FESTIVAL?

TRAVELING ON THE 405

Take the 405 Fwy South and exit at Crenshaw Blvd. From the off ramp, turn right onto Crenshaw Blvd. and travel south to Torrance Blvd. Turn right onto Torrance Blvd. and travel west to Madrona Ave. Turn right onto Madrona Ave. and turn into the first driveway on the right hand side. The Torrance Cultural Arts Center is the large multi-building complex to your left once you have entered the parking lot.

TRAVELING ON THE 101

Take the 101 South to the 110 South to the 405 North and exit at Crenshaw Blvd. From the off ramp, turn left onto 182nd St., then make a left onto Crenshaw Blvd. Travel south on Crenshaw to Torrance Blvd. Turn right onto Torrance Blvd. and travel west to Madrona Ave. Turn right onto Madrona Ave. and turn into the first driveway on the right hand side. The Torrance Cultural Arts Center is the large multi-building complex to your left once you have entered the parking lot.

LOS ANGELES

Take the 110 Fwy South to the 405 Fwy North and exit at Crenshaw Blvd. From the off ramp, turn left onto 182nd St., then make a left onto Crenshaw Blvd. Travel south on Crenshaw to Torrance Blvd. Turn right onto Torrance Blvd. and travel west to Madrona Ave. Turn right onto Madrona Ave. and turn into the first driveway on the right hand side. The Torrance Cultural Arts Center is the large multi-building complex to your left once you have entered the parking lot.

WHERE CAN I PARK MY CAR AT THE FESTIVAL?

Parking is free and plentiful at the Torrance Cultural Arts Center

IS RE-ENTRY ALLOWED AT THE FESTIVAL?

Yes, your All-Access wristband allows you to move freely throughout the paid and free-to-the-public areas

CAN I PURCHASE TICKETS AT THE FESTIVAL?

Yes, tickets will be available for purchase in-person on the day of the event only, starting at 8:30am. We suggest purchasing your ticket to the festival online or by phone now, as the event could sell out.

SHOULD I BRING MY UKULELE WITH ME TO THE FESTIVAL?

Absolutely! The festival is an interactive, hands-on event. If you don't have an ukulele of your own, consider purchasing the All-Access + ukulele package. There will be plenty of vendors selling ukulele in a variety of styles and prices onsite as well.

ARE THERE ATM MACHINES AT THE FESTIVAL?

Yes, there will be an ATM onsite at the festival

WILL I BE ABLE TO PURCHASE FOOD AND DRINKS AT THE FESTIVAL?

Yes! There will be a variety of food, drink and shave ice vendors available all day at the festival.

ARE THERE LOCKERS AVAILABLE?

There are no lockers available on the festival grounds. Please be sure to secure your personal belongings and do not leave items unattended. Los Angeles International Ukulele Festival, Kala Koa, and Torrance Cultural Arts Center are not responsible for any lost or stolen items.

I PURCHASED THE ALL-ACCESS ENTRY + UKULELE; HOW DO I PICK UP MY UKULELE?

Upon arrival, show your ID at the front booth to receive your festival access wristband. Show your wristband at the Ohana booth in the Entry Plaza where your ukulele (and free gig bag) will be waiting for you, all tuned up and ready to go!

HOW DO I ENTER TO WIN PRIZES?

Drawing tickets will be available for purchase in the Ken Miller Rec Center lobby, \$5 each or \$20 for five. Drawings are scheduled for 9:15am, 12:30pm, 4:15pm. You do not need to be present to win but it would be nice to be able to present it to you on the main stage!

DOES THE FESTIVAL OFFER DISABILITY ASSISTANCE?

All areas on the grounds of the Torrance Cultural Arts Center are wheelchair accessible. ADA parking is offered on a first come, first served basis. We suggest arriving early to secure an ADA parking space if needed. A state-issued accessible parking license plate, placard, or hangtag is required to park in this area. Pets are not allowed except for service animals.
